Sanford Police Working to End the Spree of Gun Violence

Over the past four days the Sanford Police Department has responded to multiple shots fired calls within the City of Sanford.

The most recent shooting took place last night, November 10, 2014, near the intersection of S. Summerlin Ave. and McKay Blvd. at approximately 9:10 p.m. A 23 year-old male sustained a gunshot wound to the leg and a 17 year-old female sustained a gunshot wound to the shoulder.

We need the community to come forward and work with us in partnership to put a stop to the gun violence, said Chief Cecil Smith. A task force between the Sanford Police Department and Seminole County Sheriff's Office was formed today in an effort to pool resources and information. Sanford Police Officers will increase the number of "Walk and Talks" within the community in an effort to open the lines of communication. The next "Walk and Talk" will take place tomorrow, November 12, 2014, in the Washington Oaks neighborhood at 1:00 p.m.
