## Project Update – August 2010

The City of Sanford (City) is not only recognized within Central Florida and throughout the State of Florida as a leader in proactive sewer rehabilitation, but the City is recognized for its excellent customer service and environmentally friendly or "green" approach to caring for water and wastewater assets. The **Sewer Infrastructure Rehabilitation Project** benefits affected subdivisions because sewer service disruptions and road damages due to sewer line failures will be greatly reduced as a result of work performed. Additionally, stormwater and groundwater that typically enter the sanitary sewer system during heavy rains will also be reduced, so the City will pay less for electric power and chemicals to pump and treat wastewater during these times.

The **Sewer Infrastructure Rehabilitation Project** involves lining pipes using a trenchless technology; this type of approach does not require excavation of old pipes and gives the existing pipes decades of new useful life. Because the pipe lining activities do not typically require excavation, disruption to the public is minimal. The surveying of manholes and pipes that occurs as part of the **Sewer Infrastructure Rehabilitation Project** also has minimal to no impact on residents.

Pipe lining work has been suspended for the remainder of the summer but will resume in mid-September, 2010. Once work begins again, only one more pipe segment will need to be lined in the Carriage Cove subdivision before work is completed there and crews begin lining pipe in the Hidden Lakes subdivision. The Sewer Infrastructure Rehabilitation Completion Schedule provides an overall project completion schedule.
